The Parish Office is located within the Civic Centre on King Street, where the Clerk, Ms. S. Hansford, Deputy Clerk, Mrs. S. Stearn and Administrator, Mrs. M. Skists are available to support parishioners with any concerns and will happily sign-post you to the appropriate body or organisation to handle your enquiry. You may have already used the Parish Council's services, without realising that a small portion of your rates support these community facilities and services and their maintenance.

This Parish Council is sole Corporate Trustee of the King George V Playing Field Charity and oversees the management of its land and facilities at Mill Lane, which includes the Children's Play Area; Woodland Area; Outdoor Gym Equipment and Car Parking facilities and it leases

land to the Enderby Bowls Club, the Enderby Lawn Tennis Club and the Enderby Cricket Club. The King George V Playing Field can also be privately hired via the Council on formal application.

The Council and its Committees usually meet every 2nd and 4th Wednesday of each month. Meetings are open to the public and are held in the Council Chamber at 7:30pm. There are three standing Committees: Recreation & Amenities Committee, Policy & Finance Committee and the Planning Committee. In addition the Council has a Library Management Committee which meets bi-monthly on a Tuesday. This Committee oversees the Council's Community Library provision and is supported by a number of Library Volunteers. Volunteer opportunities are available for those interested. Remembrance Day Procession - Sunday, 10th November, 2024

Residents of the local area are invited to support the Remembrance Day Procession through Enderby. Since the British Legion disbanded the Enderby and Narborough District Girl Guiding Association & 38th Enderby & Narborough Scout Movement have tried their upmost to continue the procession involving the next generation.

The support of 'locals' is invaluable and those taking part in the procession really do appreciate the route being lined with people, as well as residents waiting patiently to exit roads in their cars, keeping those in the procession safe.

Service men and women past and present or representatives wearing medals on others' behalf are most welcome to join in the parade. This gives the younger generation a real sense of purpose.

On Sunday,10th November 2024, the procession will leave the base of Mill Lane at 10:15am, walk through the Centre of the Village, via The Cross and Chapel Street, up to Enderby United Reformed Church then travel back down and along Broad Street to the Enderby Parish Church.

Both churches accommodate the children for a service and all are welcome to join them. The United Reformed Church leads a service for the younger members of the Guiding & Scouting movement whereas the Parish Church holds the more formal service with the act of Remembrance.

Please note the Leicestershire County Council has stipulated members of the public **should not** walk by the side of the procession therefore space has been allowed at the rear of the uniformed groups for people who wish to join the procession. Thank you for your co-operation.

PARISH COMMUNICATION & LIBRARY RESOURCE

Enderby Parish Council works diligently to keep its parishioners informed on matters relating to the business of the Council. Primarily the Council communicates with parishioners through the display of its Agendae and publicity of upcoming events. In addition, The Enderby Connection Newsletter is generated periodically to provide details of the work being undertaken by the Parish Council on behalf of parishioners.

Noticeboards are a proven method to effectively communicate with parishioners and by popular demand the Council has this year upgraded

remaining wooden noticeboards with aluminium cabinet style noticeboards. Essentially, a decision was taken to protect notices during inclement weather and to reduce littering within the Village, as the Council was aware many of these notices were becoming detached.

There is a broad demographic within the area and the Council endeavours to reach everyone; particularly those experiencing difficulty accessing digital facilities.

Parishioners are reminded of the computer resources available at the Enderby Community Library, where 6no. computer stations are available for use. The sign-up process to become a Library Member is very simple and takes only a few minutes with an appropriate form of identification.

The Library is a cool and inviting space to escape to from the summer heat and a warm and welcoming environment during the winter months. Public Wi-Fi access is available also in the event that you wish to use your own electronic equipment and need a space to work remotely. The Library meeting room may be booked during service hours for a £10 hourly rate which goes directly to the Enderby Community Library service provision.

Enderby Parish Council's Major Project Proposals

Open Space Acquisition

The Parish Council has for many years kept a watching brief over Enderby's open space areas in order to expand its offering to parishioners and for a number of years the Parish Council has been in discussion with the Blaby District Council regarding the acquisition of additional open space through the means of devolved services.

As always, the Council remains transparent and

steadfast in its desire to retain green space in perpetuity for the benefit of parishioners and will in the future explore its ability to secure a number of key areas including Jubilee



Park and Southey Recreational Ground.

The Children's Play Area at Southey Recreational Ground is presently leased, as is the Play area at Aldeby Close which borders Jubilee Park. Blaby District Council has maintained



these much larger areas for many years and the Enderby Parish Council has continued to work closely with the Blaby District Council to ensure these areas area well maintained allowing these areas to be enjoyed by everyone.

The Parish Council's ability to secure both Southey Recreational Ground and Jubilee Park (St. Johns) is of significant importance and early stages of negotiation with the Blaby District Council is underway.

It is hoped the Parish Council will be fortuitous in securing these open space areas for the benefit of the Community in the near future.

Civic Centre Re-roofing Project

Like many local businesses, the Parish Council also sustained significant water damage during recent weather conditions.




